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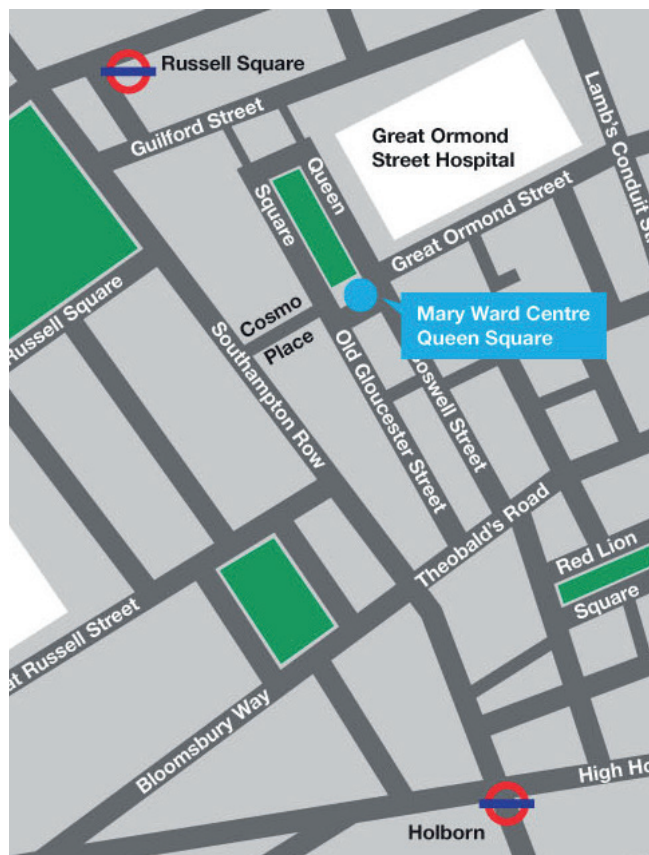

PROGRESSION COURSES - TAKING THE NEXT STEP

Thinking about a career change or studying Art, Craft or Design at University? Or do you just want to develop your creative practice more fully?

These courses provide an opportunity to build your skills and further develop your interests and talents in the Visual Arts.

You will work in supportive and friendly group environments with the guidance and tuition of experienced tutors who are practising artists, makers and creatives themselves.

Mary Ward can also offer additional learning support to those who may need it and bursaries are available to those in financial difficulty.

PATTERN CUTTING: BEGINNERS/MASTERCLASSES

Beginners learn the essentials of flat pattern cutting. You will learn how to lay a block on paper and to make pattern adaptations to realise your own designs. Your patterns will be cut out in calico and constructed into a toile (set garment) using a range of sewing techniques.

Our Masterclasses are perfect for experienced and intermediate sewers. Spend a day brushing up on advanced sewing techniques and elements of garment construction—e.g:

- Darts, tucks, pleats and gathers
- Fastenings inc. buttons, hooks, Rouleau, studs and Velcro
- Zips—centred, lapped and concealed
- Waistbands—straight, shaped and elastic

*PRE-FOUNDATION IN ART & DESIGN

For students who have just rediscovered their love for art and who want to develop their practice or prepare a portfolio for Foundation and Higher Education. Treat yourself to a year of Drawing, Painting, Printmaking and Sculpture. Develop your skills and creative ideas and produce a broad Fine Arts portfolio.

This is a qualification course and good attendance is expected: NCFE level 2 certificate. The course can be paid in instalments.

*MARY WARD FOUNDATION IN ART & DESIGN

Develop your own practice and prepare a portfolio for BA or MA. Three terms of personal projects aimed at developing 2D and 3D art in various media, and culminating in production of a written artist's statement and presentation of your work through exhibition.

This is a qualification course and good attendance is expected: BTEC L3 540 Diploma. This course can be paid for using a student Loan or by instalments.
